DANIA SCANDINAVIAN SCHOOL UNIFORM POLICY

In line with Scandinavian educational tradition, children are given a choice to wear what they choose. The school endeavours to maintain a smart functional dress code. All items must be clearly labelled with a sewn-in nametape.

All weather clothing: All children will need to keep seasonal clothing at school, such as waterproof clothing and waterproof boots.

Spare Clothing: Each child should keep a spare full set of clothing in a named bag at school.

School Trips/Outings: children are expected to wear official Dania fluorescent gilets over the top of their clothes when outside of school premises during school hours.

Footwear: Pupils must be able to put on and take off their own shoes. If necessary, this may mean pupils wearing shoes that fasten with Velcro or buckles. Indoor shoes are required in preschool.

Physical Education: Children should wear suitable clothing for exercise such as tracksuit bottoms or shorts and a t-shirt or sweatshirt and plimsolls/trainers.

Swimming: Suitable swimming costume and swimming cap
